Mix up all of your scenario cards and place them all upside down with six in a row. Do this four times so that you have four rows of six.

Choose the youngest player in your family to go first! The first player can flip over any two cards. If the colored icons on the top don't match, flip them back over in the place that you found them.

NOTE: Do your best to not forget what was on the cards you flipped, because knowing where certain cards are will help you as the game goes on!

Moving clockwise around the circle, the next player repeats this step, only flipping over two cards at a time.

When you find a match (matching icons in the same color), read the scenarios on each card and choose which one you think shows someone choosing pride and which one shows someone choosing humility. The player who found the match, keeps the pair.

Repeat until there are no remaining matches. The player who has collected the most pairs by the end of the game, wins!


